Who is this qualification for?

- This is a mandatory requirement for anyone wishing to complete a qualification within the Level 3 Active Leisure Learning Apprenticeship Framework

What prior qualifications/levels of attainment are needed to take this qualification? Are there any age restrictions?

No previous experience or qualifications are required however learners should be aged 16+ and have basic skills in communication pitched at Level 2 (discussing, presenting, reading and writing)

What does this qualification cover?

The YMCA Awards Level 3 Award in Employment Awareness in Active Leisure and Learning is regulated by Ofqual and comprises of a total of 3 mandatory units awarding a total of 8

- Understanding Employment Rights and Responsibilities (2 credits)
- Understanding the Active Leisure and Learning Sector (3 credits)
- Understanding the Employing Organisation (3 credits)

It equips learners with the following specialist knowledge, understanding and skills

- Employment law, industry specific legislation and procedures that apply to their jobs
- Career opportunities and employment rights and responsibilities.
- The subsectors that make up the active leisure and learning sector
- The aims, objectives and structure of their organisation and contribution that they make
