# Role Specification – Tutor



Tutors are on the front line planning, delivering and evaluating programmes of learning to meet the needs of all learners registered on YMCA Awards qualifications.

## Responsibilities

Tutors will:

## 1. Plan programmes of learning

#### To include:

- 1.1. appropriately scheduling learning hours for subject areas
- allowing adequate time for practical demonstrations and practical workshops
- 1.3. scheduling time for learner guidance and support, programme and learning reviews

# 2. Deliver programmes of learning to an appropriate standard

#### To include:

- 2.1. using of a variety of teaching methods to accommodate different learning needs, abilities and experience
- 2.2. making arrangements for specific learner guidance and support
- 2.3. monitoring learners progress throughout the programme, providing feedback to assist learner development
- 2.4. ensuring all aspects of the YMCA Awards syllabus including specified aims, learning outcomes and assessment criteria are covered through the programme

- 2.5. providing access to appropriate support materials and resources
- 2.6. ensuring availability of physical resources
- making regular learning checks and actively involve learners in the learning process

## 3. Maintain accurate records

## To include:

- 3.1. detailed lesson plans and programme outlines
- 3.2. registers of learner attendance
- 3.3. records of learner non-attendance and provisions to support learning
- 3.4. records of learner development, progress and support offered
- 3.5. records of reasonable adjustments

## 4. Maintain knowledge and competence in their subject area(s)

#### To include:

- 4.1. providing accurate and current information to learners for all programmes
- 4.2. ensuring the level of information provided is relevant to the qualification and appropriate for learner needs
- 4.3. completing regular Continuing Professional Development (CPD) activities

# 5. Evaluate the learning programme

### To include:

- 5.1. mid and end of programme reviews
- 5.2. gathering feedback from stakeholders including learners, other tutors, assessors and quality assurance staff
- 5.3. listing action points to improve future delivery
- 5.4. recording evaluations and sharing information with the delivery team

## **Qualification requirements**

Tutors usually require a discipline specific qualification at or above the level being delivered, as well as one of the following teaching qualifications (or an equivalent):

- Level 3 Award, Level 4 Certificate or Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training
- Bachelor of Education (BEd)
- Certificate in Education (Cert Ed)
- Preparing to Teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector (PTLLS)
- Certificate in Teaching in the Lifelong Learning Sector (CTLLS)
- Diploma in Teaching in the Lifelong Learning Sector (DTLLS)
- City & Guilds Further and Adult Education Teaching Certificate
- Postgraduate Certificate in Education(PGCE)
- SVQ Learning and Development (units should relate to provision of learning and development)

YMCA Awards will consider approving individuals working towards a teaching qualification provided this is achieved within 12 months of approval.
